School Meal Charges

From Thursday 1st April 2021, school meal charges will be increasing to £2.50 per meal or £12.50 per week. The service has incurred increases in labour and food costs, which has affected the price per meal.

Absences

If your child is not attending school, you should inform the office by 9:30am. This also applies to children that are accessing remote learning at home. We are still required to follow DFE guidance. If your child attends school currently on agreed days, they are expected to attend each day, unless they are unwell. If you have agreed for your child to attend school and you keep them off school (and they aren't unwell), this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.



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
